Laws = Rules

Rules that describes behaviour banned by the government because it threatens and harms public safety and welfare.

They also establish punishment to be required for breaking the law including being arrested, fined and or **Prison Detention.**

Common School rules which are also the law!

School Rules

No Bullying

Deliberately hurtful behaviour, repeated over a period of time.

No Cyber Bullying

The use of electronic communication to bully a person, typically by sending messages of an intimidating or threatening nature.

No stealing

It is not acceptable to take someone else property without their consent ie pencil case, coat, money or School items.

No hitting people

It is not acceptable to deliberately hit, kick, or punch someone or use any other unwarranted physical behaviour.

No damaging property

Other children's and School property should be looked after. You are not allowed to damage, deface or break anyone else property or equipment.

The Law

Protection from Harassment Act 1997

Cause alarm, harassment or distress through a course of conduct.

Communications Act 2003

Sends by electronic communications a message or other matter that is grossly offensive or of an indecent, obscene or menacing character.

Theft Act 1968

A person is guilty of theft if he dishonestly takes property belonging to another with the intention of permanently depriving the other of it.

Offences Against the Person Act 1861

An intentional act by one person that creates a fear in another of an imminent harmful or offensive contact and or physical assault.

Criminal Damage Act 1971

A person without lawful excuse destroys or damages property belonging to another intending to destroy or damage any property or reckless as to whether the property would be destroyed or damaged.

This is why it is so important to behave at school!



Warning!

Alcohol...

Is actually a depressant which means it's a drug that slows down or depresses the brain.

Alcohol...

Alters your ability to think, speak, & see things as they really are & your ability to identify dangerous situations.

Alcohol...

Isnt good for Children and can have devastating consequences ie alcohol poisoning and choking in your own sick

Alcohol...

Can cause uncontrollable emotions like crying, anger & not being able to control your body functions ie poo or wee yourself

Children - Drinking alcohol can have devastating effects!

Legal drugs...

- Are tested in laboratories by professional scientists to be as safe as possible for humans to take.
- Are generally known to people as pharmaceutical drugs or medicine.
- Are often prescribed by a doctor and picked up from a chemist to treat, cure and prevent illness and disease.
- Have to be taken exactly as the doctor states.

Illegal drugs...

- Are often made in unhealthy conditions by dishonest people and are extremely unsafe.
- Are often made to different strengths and mixes which the body cannot handle.
- Can be mixed with such things as brick dust, rat poison and dog poo.
- Possession or supply is a crime and you will be arrested by the Police.

Illegal drugs are extremely dangerous









Can you Solve the crime?

Be careful not to damage any evidence, so be gentle. Write a description of the article, what you think it is and what evidence could be gained at each station




Who killed Bobbie Moss?
